

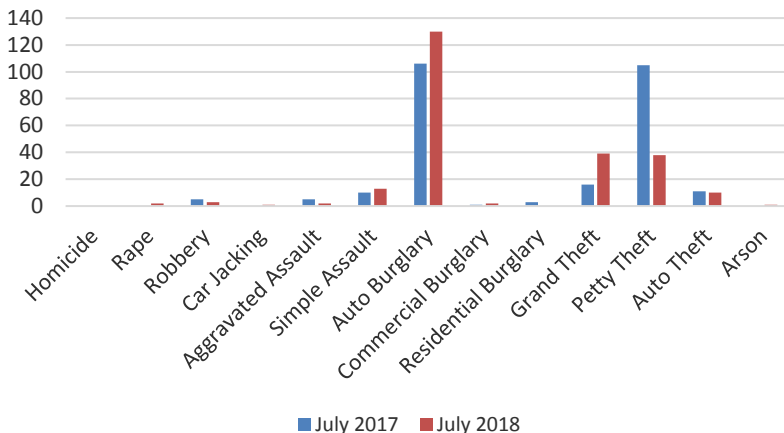

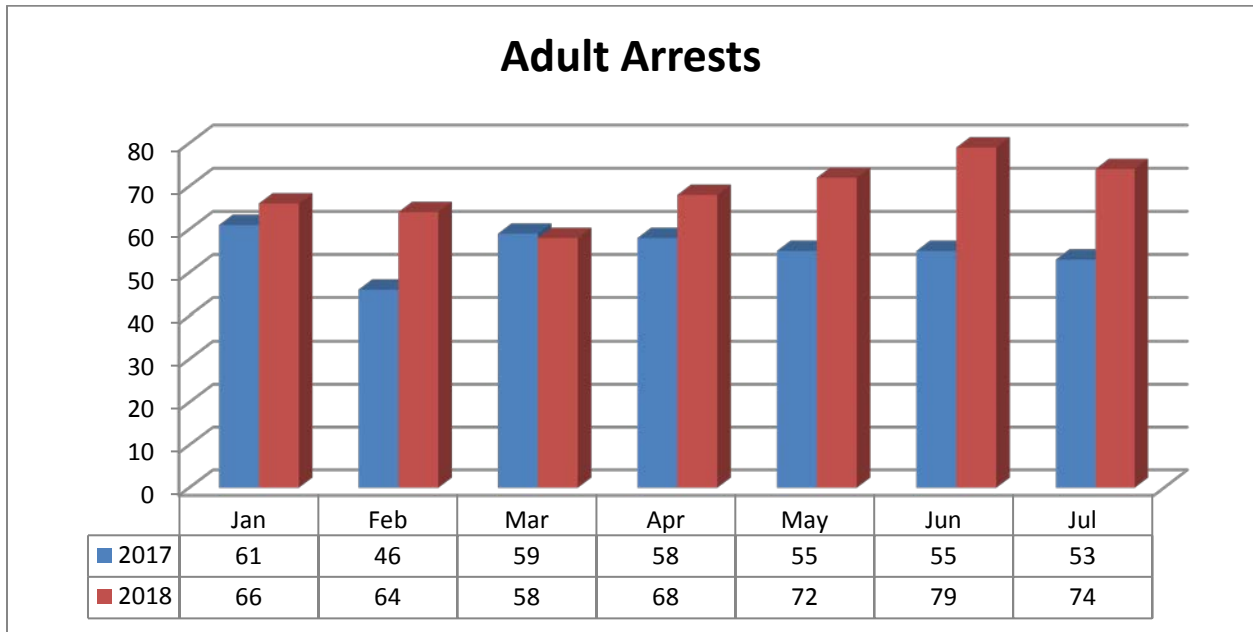

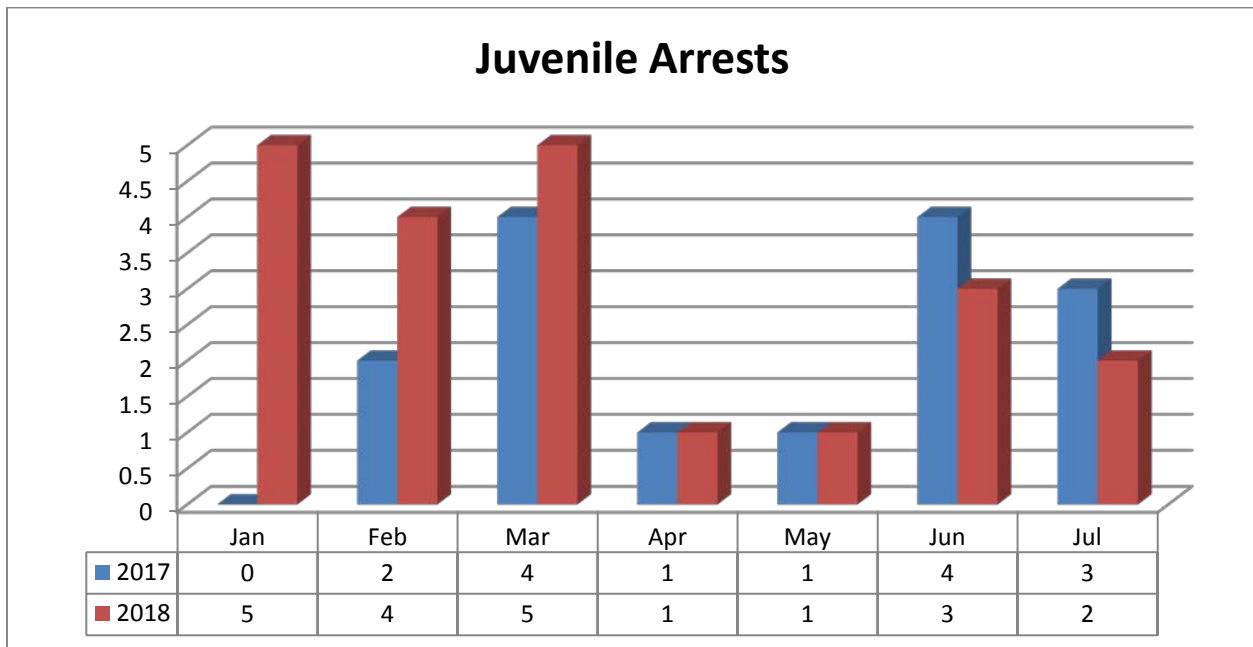

Rape: In District 4 at the Hilton Garden Inn, 1800 Powell St., an attempted rape occurred. The suspect and victim are acquaintances. EPD arrested the suspect shortly thereafter. In District 8 at a residence on the 3900 block of Adeline St., a rape occurred. The suspect and victim were new acquaintances. Oakland Police Department sent a courtesy report to our Department reporting the incident.

Robbery: In District 5 in the alleyway near BevMo, 5717 Christie Ave., a male suspect pointed a gun at a female and demanded the female's purse. The victim complied. Afterwards the suspect fled towards the rear parking lot. Suspect: Male, 20-30 years old, 6'0" - 6'3", short hair, clean shaven, prescription glasses, wearing a tan or brown shirt and blue jeans. At UNIQLO, 5606 Bay St., a male shoplifter concealed merchandise in a bag and left the store without paying. A loss prevention agent attempted to confront the suspect, however the suspect fled. The agent chased after the suspect and saw the suspect reach into his jacket and pull out a knife. The agent backed off. EPD arrived and arrested the suspect shortly thereafter. The loss was recovered. In District 10 at Target, 1555 40th St., a male victim arranged to sell his laptop with a potential buyer from the LetGo buy/sell/trade app.

Suspect #1 entered the store and spoke to the victim about the price and then left the store. Suspect #2 entered the store, approached the victim, grabbed the laptop and the victim's iPhone from the victim's hand and fled the store. S#1: Male, 6'0", thin build, late teens, early 20s, wearing a gray hoodie with the hood up. S#2: Male, 20s, 5'7"- 5'9", heavysset, scruffy beard, short black hair, wearing a dark colored sweatshirt. Suspect Vehicle: 2006-2009, Gray Honda Accord 4-Door with a rear spoiler, partial license plate 7MB????.

Car Jacking: In District 2 at 64th/Doyle St., an attempt carjacking occurred. A female victim was driving her vehicle westbound on 64th St., when suddenly a vehicle pulled alongside the victim's vehicle, preventing the victim from proceeding. A male suspect exited the front passenger seat of the suspect vehicle and walked towards the victim as if he was going to open the victim's vehicle door. The victim feared for her safety, put her vehicle in reverse, accelerated towards Vallejo St., and left the area. Suspect: Male, 20s, wearing dark clothing. Suspect Vehicle: Silver sedan, no further description.

Aggravated Assault: In District 8 at Lane Splitter, 3645 San Pablo Ave., a known transient became irate and made several threats of throwing a knife at an employee. The suspect had a knife in his hand and simulated throwing the knife several times. EPD arrested the suspect shortly thereafter. Suspect: Male, 5'5", 170 lbs., wearing a yellow hat, red plaid shirt, and blue jeans. **At 39XX Adeline St.,** (3) male suspects occupying a stolen vehicle attempted to run over a male victim, who jumped out of the way, however was struck on his left leg by the vehicle. The vehicle then collided into the concrete wall of the apartment complex, backed up, and fled the area. The victim refused medical. This appears to be a random act of violence.

Commercial Burglary: In District 2 at Coulter Steel & Forge Co., 1494 67th St., employees noticed someone had entered the building and searched through lockers in the locker room. The loss is undetermined. **In District 8 at the Oasis Pamper Bar, 3817 San Pablo Ave.,** POE: Window. LOSS: Candy machine.

Arson: In District 3 at the old Nady Systems site 6701 Shellmound St., an unknown suspect set fire to a part of the building. The fire was contained and extinguished.

Auto Theft: (10) Vehicles were stolen this month, (4) of which were recovered intact, (2) vehicles were damaged, and (4) vehicles are still outstanding. Honda and Nissan vehicles were popular.
