5. Action Items

5.1. Review of BPAC Accomplishments for 2020/2021 and Establishment of Goals and Priorities for 2021/2022

Chair Harr reviewed the annual report from 2019/2020. BPAC members discussed successes from 2020 and listed priorities for 2021.

BPAC MSP Scheuerman/Harr/8-0-0-1 to use the report format from 2019 and 2020 with content modifications as discussed by the BPAC.

BPAC MSP McCamy/Scheuerman/7-1-0-1 that the first highlighted priority be development of the active transportation plan and the second highlighted priority be identifying solutions to issues at the Powell/Christie intersection.

5.2. Bike East Bay Bike to Wherever Day Sponsorship

Staff Anderson presented on the upcoming May 21st Bike to Wherever Day hosted by Bike East Bay. Public comment received from Dave Campbell of Bike East Bay regarding outcomes of 2020 Bike to Wherever Day and anticipated activities for 2021 Bike to Wherever Day.

BPAC MSP Modic/McCamy/8-0-0-1 to recommend that City Council sponsor 2021 Bike to Wherever Day at the Bronze Level Sponsorship level of \$2,500.

5.3. Summary of Council Direction on BPAC Motions

Staff Humphrey and Councilmember Medina presented a summary of Council recommendations for BPAC motions from the previous quarter.

5.4. Dockless Mobility Update

Staff Humphrey presented an update on the dockless mobility ordinance amendment going to Council, including locking requirements and mandatory response times. BPAC members discussed opportunities and timeline for gig car-sharing and scooter-share regulations as well as physical infrastructure changes. Clarifications were made on low-income pricing and rates of motorized vs standard bikeshare.

5.5. Council Update

Update combined with Item 5.3. Councilmember Medina presented update on Council activities including Alameda County Transportation Committee grant proposals, rollout of parking meter program, and updated Regional Housing Needs Allocation numbers.

5.6. Planning Department Update

Staff Oaks presented upcoming active transportation plan agenda item and two existing vacancies on the Emeryville Planning Commission. Both applications are due by Monday, March 15th.

5.7. Public Works Department Update

Staff Houlihan provided updates on the Bayfront Bridge. Staff O'Connell presented updates on various Public Works projects including Doyle Street project improvements and phase three changes, 40th Street multimodal enhancement grant application, and San Pablo Avenue midblock crossing. Public comment was received on the Doyle St. project, Greenway transition from Emeryville to Berkeley, and upcoming Oakland bikeway construction.
