

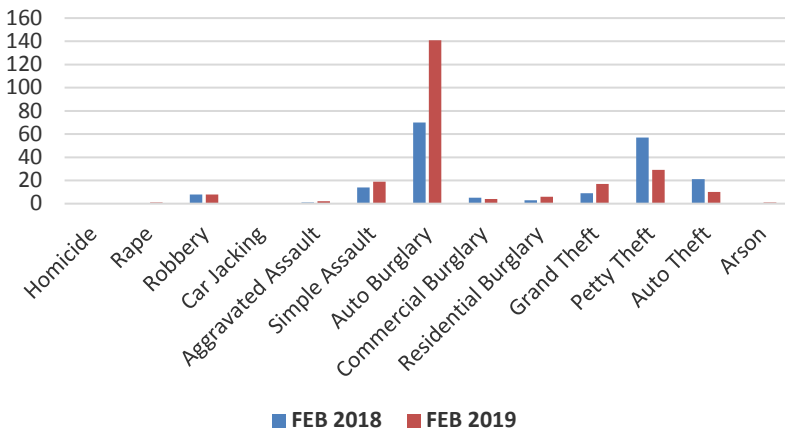

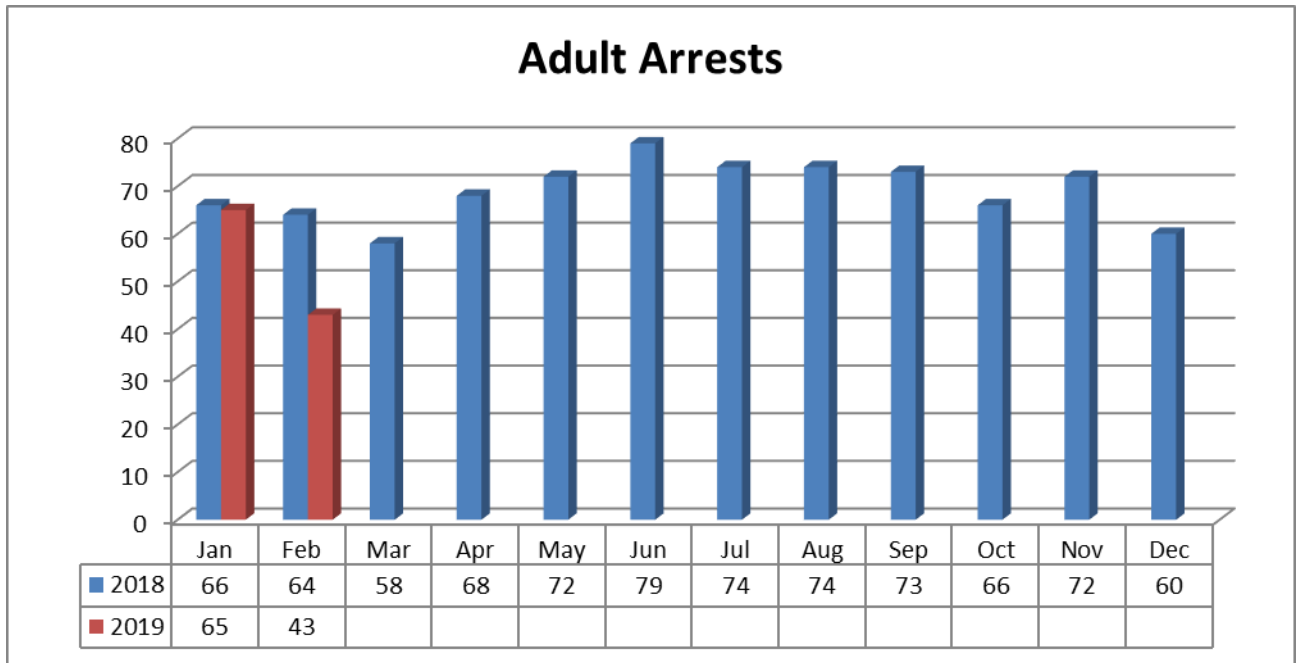

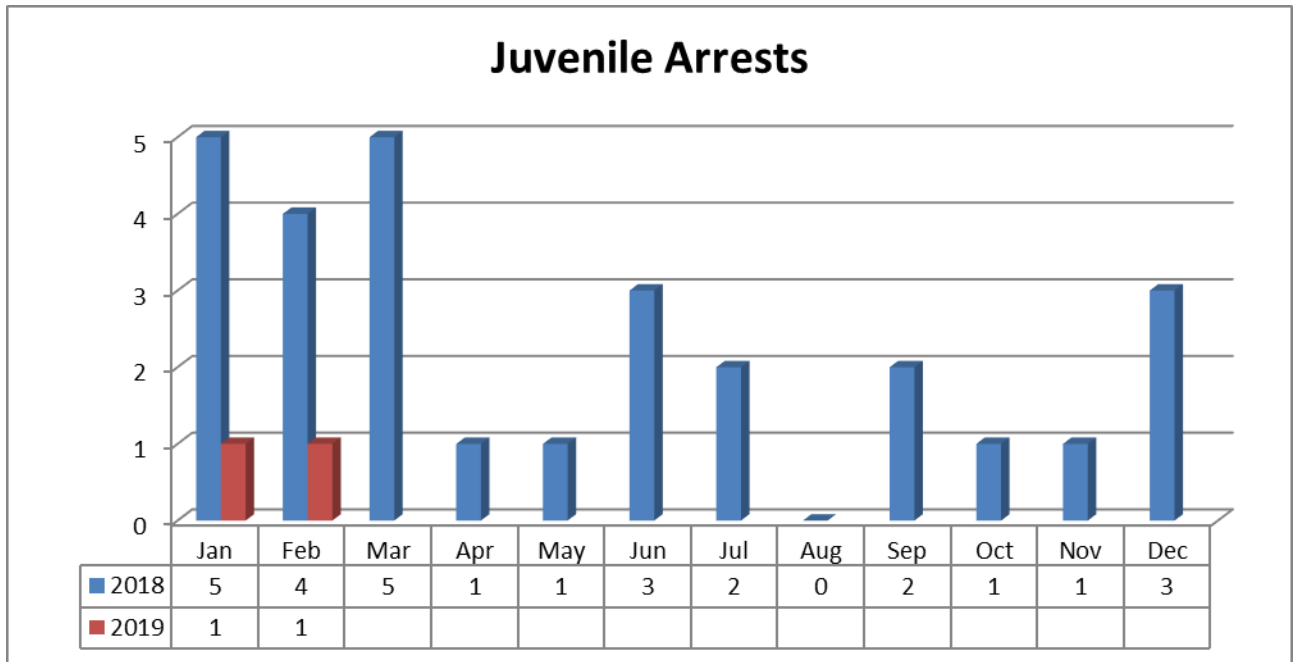

Rape: In District 9 in the rear of Pak N Save, 3889 San Pablo Ave., a female was raped by a male acquaintance. EPD later arrested the suspect.

Robbery: In District 4 at Hilton Garden Inn, 1800 Powell St., a male suspect robbed a female acquaintance. LOSS: A purse. In District 5 at Uniqlo, 5606 Bay St., a female shoplifter pepper sprayed a store employee as she fled with store merchandise. The employee recovered the loss. LOSS/RECOVERED: Uniqlo baby clothes. In District 5 in front of the Alameda County Fire Station, 2333 Powell St., an argument ensued between friends resulting in the male robbing his female friend of her wallet and cigarettes. Suspect: Male, 6'0", 330 lbs. EPD arrested the suspect shortly thereafter. In front of the AMC Bay Street 16, 5614 Bay St., #220, an attempted robbery occurred. A male juvenile attempted to grab a females' cell phone from her hand. EPD arrested the juvenile shortly thereafter. In District 7 at the Oaks Card Club, 4097 San Pablo Ave., an attempted robbery occurred. A male suspect walked towards a card table, pulled out a handgun, and attempted to grab a pile of chips on the table. However, an Oaks employee grabbed the suspect from behind and thwarted the crime. The suspect pointed the gun at the employee and then fled the area. LOSS: None. Suspect: Male, wearing a black or blue hooded sweatshirt, black shorts, tall black socks, and rose-tinted sunglasses.

In District 8 in front of 10XX 41st St., an attempted robbery occurred. A male recycling items attempted to grab another male's cell phone from his hand. EPD arrested the suspect shortly thereafter. **In District 9 at Home Depot, 3838 Hollis St.**, a male shoplifter from previous thefts, selected merchandise, proceeded through the self-check registers without paying, and exited the store. Loss Prevention agents approached the suspect and noticed the butt of a handgun in the suspect's waistband. The suspect then fled the store. EPD arrested the suspect shortly thereafter. The gun was not recovered. **At Subway, 3999 San Pablo Ave.**, a suspect simulated a gun and demanded cash from the register. Suspect: Male, 22-24 years old, 5'9", medium build, wearing a black or gray hoodie with a black mask covering the lower half of his face. LOSS: \$100.

Aggravated Assault: In District 4 at Chevy's Restaurant, 1890 Powell St., a patron threw a glass cup at an employee. The employee sustained an injury. **In District 9 In the parking lot of Starbucks Coffee, 3839 Emery St.**, a domestic violence incident resulted in a man hitting his wife with a hard object. The husband was gone on our arrival.

Commercial Burglary: In District 4 at 3306 Powell St., (Storage container) POE: Lock slipped. LOSS: A generator and tools. **At 3300 Powell St., (Storage Locker)** POE: Lock cut. LOSS: A hand truck, camp stove and plumbing fittings. **In District 7 at Los Contaros, 4115 San Pablo Ave.**, POE: Rear door – Pried. LOSS: \$1403.03 cash. **At Emeryville City Hall, 1333 Powell St.**, POE: Unknown – No signs of forced entry. LOSS: A pot.

Residential Burglary: In District 1 at 12XX Ocean Ave., POE: Garage door. LOSS: Unknown. **In District 2 at 64XX Hollis St.**, the outgoing mail box was pried open. LOSS: Unknown. Suspect: Male wearing a brown jacket and blue jeans, carrying a small crowbar. **At 14XX 65th St.**, POE: Apartment door – Unlocked. LOSS: (2) computers. **In District 8 at 10XX 48th St.**, POE: Front door – Unlocked, and one person was home asleep. LOSS: (2) Jewelry boxes. **At 39XX Adeline St.** two burglaries occurred. POE: Door – pried. LOSS: (2) bicycles.

Auto Theft: (10) Vehicles were stolen, (6) of which were recovered intact, (1) Vehicle was recovered with damages, and (3) Vehicles are still outstanding. Chevy's and Honda were popular during this month.
