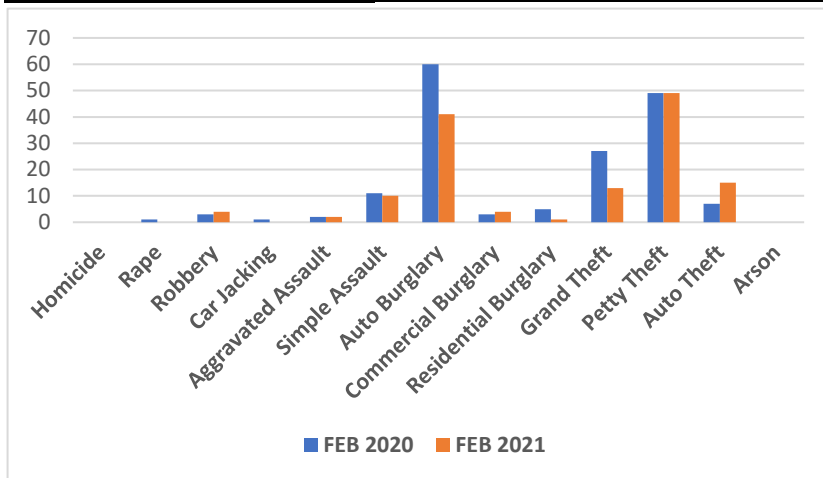

**Robbery: In District 9 in front of Nordstrom Rack, 3839 Emery St., #100. ATTEMPT.** A male suspect and female victim struggled over the victim's purse. The suspect fled after bystanders ran towards the victim to assist her. SUSPECT: Male, 20s, skinny build, wearing a black hat, a black hoodie, and a mask. SUSPECT VEHICLE: Jaguar XKE, black, with one red rim. **At Wells Fargo Bank, 1199 40<sup>th</sup> St., ATTEMPT.** A male suspect passed a demand note to the bank teller. The bank teller did not pay attention to the note and asked the suspect for his Identification. The suspect appeared confused and fled out of the bank. SUSPECT: Male, light complexion, hazel/green eyes, wearing a gray hat, a black mask, a black jacket, and brown boots. **In front of Home Depot, 3838 Hollis St.,** a male suspect approached a male who was selling oranges and tried to take his wallet. The victim resisted and the suspect knocked the victim to the ground. A female accomplice approached the suspect saying, "Let's go, it's not worth it". The suspect and female then fled to their vehicle and left the area. LOSS: None. SUSPECT: Male, 20s, 5'5", 150 lbs., short black hair with red streaks, wearing a full gold grill on his teeth, a black jacket, black pants, and black and red Jordan tennis shoes. SUSPECT VEHICLE: Unknown license plate, Honda Accord, 4-Door, gray. **In District 10 in the parking lot of Target, 1555 40<sup>th</sup> St.,** a male ripped a cell phone and purse from the victim's hand. SUSPECT: Male, 18-20 years old, medium build, wearing a black beanie, black face mask, and dark clothing.

**Aggravated Assault: In District 7 at CVS Pharmacy, 4349 San Pablo Ave.,** an impatient customer grabbed two 16oz energy drinks from the cooler and threw them at the cashier. One drink struck the cashier on the arm and the other drink struck the cashier on the back of the head. The suspect and two female associates fled the store. SUSPECT: Male, 6'0", heavy set, with short thick dreads, wearing a dark hoodie. SUSPECT VEHICLE: Newer, Nissan sedan, navy blue. **In District 10 in the parking lot of Panera Brea, 1525 40<sup>th</sup> St.,** during a domestic violence incident, a female punched her boyfriend in the eye fracturing his orbital socket.

**Commercial Burglary: In District 3 at Public Storage, 6501 Shellmound St.,** POE: Storage locker - Lock replaced. LOSS: Several items of value. **In District 4 at the Hilton Garden Inn, 1800 Powell St., ATTEMPT.** EPD arrested a male suspect for attempting to break into rooms. **In District 7 at Boyd's Body Shop, 1245 Powell St.,** an unknown suspect used an unknown tool to cut through the fence. Once inside the yard, the suspect rummaged through several vehicles. LOSS: Unknown. **In District 8 at the German International School, 1070 41<sup>st</sup> St.,** POE: Classroom window – Screen removed. LOSS: Unknown. SUSPECT: Male wearing a beanie, a dark jacket, and dark pants.

**Residential Burglary: In District 6 at 43XX Horton St.,** POE: Front glass door – Window smashed. LOSS: two packages that were on the floor, and the suspects pried open several mailboxes and stole mail. SUSPECTS: #1 Male, 6'0", slim build, wearing a black face mask and all black clothing. #2 Female, wearing a white face mask, a black jacket with "Champion" stitched on the front, blue jeans, and black shoes.

**Auto Theft:** (13) Vehicles were stolen this month including (2) attempted thefts. (6) Vehicles were recovered, (5) of which were recovered intact, and (1) vehicle had minor stripping. Chevy, Ford, and GMC trucks were popular this month.
