**Subject:** Informational Item # 6.1 - Sutter Hospital Project Review (First)

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The purpose of this memo is to provide a brief summary of the review process for large private development projects as it has been some time since the BPAC agenda included such proposals due to a general slow-down in the economy.

The Sutter Hospital project needs two types of permits: a Planned Unit Development (PUD) Amendment and a General Plan Amendment. The final decision-maker on these permits is the City Council with the Planning Commission making a recommendation to the Council.

The project is first presented to various City Committees, which include BPAC, Parks and Recreation Committee and the Commission on Aging. Each committee provides comments on the project in their advisory capacity. These comments will be summarized in the staff report that will be prepared for the Planning Commission Study Session (June 25<sup>th</sup>) and for the City Council Study Session (July 21<sup>st</sup>). It is anticipated that there will be at least two cycles of study sessions.

The City has retained Urban Planning Partners (UPP) to do an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) as necessitated by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The EIR will analyze the project's impacts (including transportation and noise) and suggest appropriate measures to mitigate those impacts. An EIR scoping session is scheduled for the August 27<sup>th</sup> Planning Commission meeting. The purpose of the scoping session is to allow members of the public an opportunity to identify key issues that the EIR would need to analyze. After the scoping session, it will take several months for the Draft EIR to be available for public review and comment. The decision-makers (Commission and Council) will need to approve/certify the EIR at a public hearing before they make any decision on the permits. The permits will then be considered for a decision first by the Planning Commission who will make a recommendation to the City Council for a final decision.
