

SWIM LEVEL DESCRIPTIONS

Parent/Child (ages 6 months - 3 years)

Water adjustment and safety skills for parent and child. This class is not designed to teach toddlers to swim independently, but to increase the comfort level of children in and around water.

Preschool (Ages 3 - 5 years)

For children with little to no water experience who star their aquatic journey through song, rhymes, and games.

Levels 1 - 4 (Ages 6 - 12 years)

• Level 1: Introduction to Water Skills

For children with little or no water experience who do not yet go underwater. The child learns to submerge face independently and is introduced to floating and locomotion in the water.

• Level 2: Fundamental Aquatic Skills

Child must be able to submerge face for 3 seconds but may not be comfortable floating independently. Child learns to float on front and back and swim on front and back for a short distance.

• Level 3: Stroke Development

Child must be able to swim on their front and float independently on front and back. Children learn back crawl and refine front crawl with rotary breathing. They are introduced to elementary backstroke.

• Level 4: Stroke Improvement

Child must swim front crawl and back craw for 10 yards. Front crawl and back crawl are refined, and elementary backstroke is learned. They are introduced to breaststroke and diving into deep water.

Adult (Ages 18+)

Group lesson for adults 18+ in beginner, intermediate and advanced swimming levels.

TAXI REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

Residents of Emeryville ages 70+ may submit an application with taxi receipts for reimbursement.

Reimbursement is limited to 90% of \$80 up to once per calendar quarter (\$72 reimbursement every three months).

As of July 1st, 2018, Lyft & Uber are now accepted!

WHAT IS 8-TO-GO?

The '8 To Go' is an on-demand shuttle service for everyone ages 70+, or people ages 18–69 who are certified to use East Bay Paratransit and residing in 94608 zip code. Once enrolled in the program, users just place a call to set-up your travel itinerary and location, it's that simple! Travel is limited to locations to and from the 94608 zip code area (which is all of Emeryville and portions of North and West Oakland including MacArthur BART, Kaiser, Sutter and more).

WHY SHOULD I USE 8-TO-GO?

This service is intended to help seniors and people with disabilities travel within the local 94608 area. Whether it's a trip to the Senior Center, grocery store, favorite restaurant, medical appointment, or religious services, 8-To-Go will provide the personalized service and attentiveness not found in other transportation services.

HOW DO I FIND MORE INFO OR SIGN-UP FOR IT?

Contact the Emeryville Senior Center by phone (510-596-3778), visit us online (www.emeryville.org) or in-person (4321 Salem Street, Emeryville) to fill out an 8-To-Go application and receive the rider's guide. Once confirmed in our system, you will receive the direct reservation line that enables you to start using 8-To-Go' at your leisure!

Senior Citizens Emery GoRound Property and Business Improvement District (PBID) Rebate

On February 2, 2016, the Emeryville City Council adopted Resolution No. 16-08 to establish a Property and Business Improvement District (PBID) Senior Rebate Program.

If you are 65 or older, own your home and pay an assessment on your property for the Emery Go Round PBID, you may apply for a Senior Rebate that could mean savings for you.

HOW PO I APPLY AND RECEIVE A REBATE?

Where can I get an application?

The application is available through the City of Emeryville Senior PBID Rebate Program:

- By calling: 510-596-4372
- By emailing: city_manager@emeryville.org
- On the City's website www.emeryville.org
 Applications are mailed out to those who have filed in past years by the end of March each year.

When can I apply?

To expedite receiving your rebate, we would appreciate submission of the application is by May 1. Each fiscal year (July-June) the City will send an application to prior applicants at the end of March.

New applicants can also submit their applications according to the timeline shown above.

• How will I get the Rebate?

Eligible seniors will receive their rebate by a mailed check from the City of Emeryville.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE SENIOR PBIP REBATE

To be eligible for the Senior PBID Rebate:

- You or your spouse or registered domestic partner must be 65 years of age or older by December 31 of the year prior to your application.
- The rebate applies to your primary residence. You or your spouse or registered domestic partner must own your primary residence and be responsible for paying the PBID assessment on it.
- You and your spouse or registered domestic partner must claim this residence as your primary residence.

What is a primary residence?

 A primary residence is a residence in Emeryville in which you reside at least a total of six months during each fiscal year (July-June).

I am under age 65 and own my residence, but my spouse is over age 65. Do we qualify?

 Either you or your spouse or registered domestic partner must be at least age 65 years of age or older by December 31 of the year prior to your application in order to qualify. If you are under age 65 and you own your home, but your spouse or registered domestic partner is over age 65 and lives with you, you will jointly qualify for the Senior PBID Rebate.

I own a multi-family residence, reside in one of the units and rent the other units out. Will I be eligible for the Rebate?

 Yes. As long as you meet all the requirements of the program, you can apply for the rebate on the proportion of PBID assessment that is applicable to your primary residence.

I am over the age of 65 and own two properties. Can I receive the rebate on both?

 No. You and your spouse or registered domestic partner can only receive one rebate per year for your primary residence. Secondary residences such as rental properties or vacation homes are not eligible for the rebate.

I am a senior who rents an apartment. Do I qualify?

 No. The rebate is available to seniors who own their home and directly pay PBID assessments.

CHANGES IN OWNERSHIP/RESIPENCE

I am moving to a new residence; how do I get the rebate?

Your move will determine if you qualify for a rebate at your new residence. You are eligible to apply for a rebate if you own and live in the residence on the property assessment due date. The following is a general guideline:

- If you take possession of your new residence <u>before</u>
 the PBID property assessment due date, you are
 eligible to apply for the rebate on your new residence. In this situation the prior owner would not be
 eligible.
- If you take possession of the residence <u>after</u> the PBID property assessment due date, you may not apply for the rebate on that property for that year, but you may apply for your old residence if you owned and lived at the property as of the PBID property assessment due date.

OTHER QUESTIONS

Does my PBID assessment have to be paid before I submit my application to receive the rebate?

Yes. Your PBID assessment must be paid prior to submitting your application for the rebate. Rebates will not be processed until after the PBID assessment due date.

My property taxes are currently in arrears. Can I submit an application to receive the Rebate?

 No. An application for the rebate will not be processed until such time as the property taxes are no longer in arrears.




ROTTEN CITY CULTURAL DISTRICT RECEIVES MAJOR GRANT FOR NEW ART PROGRAMS

One of just 14 State recognized Cultural Districts in 2017, the Rotten City Cultural District in Emeryville is set apart from the other districts, by its recognition as a center of makers and innovators, often hidden behind roll up doors. But like the other districts, state funding was limited to minor stipends for marketing and while this resulted in 25 attractive banners featuring local artists' works in City Hall, the greater vision for the District has yet to be realized. In June 2023 the City received \$671,000 to fund the Rotten City Cultural District for two years of programming of arts activities.

With a high per capita presence of working artists and such cultural meccas as Pixar Studios and Compound Gallery, the Rotten City Cultural District runs the length of Emeryville, CA centered on the Hollis Street corridor where makers and innovators in the arts can be found east and west of the spine of Hollis Street, with Compound Galley anchoring the north end and City Hall and Pixar Animation Studios at the south end. At the heart of the corridor, resplendent with a concentration of newly installed murals are Wareham Development's Campus, the Emeryville Celebration of the Arts, the 45th Artists' Cooperative, The Gallery at the Emery and Jered's Pottery. The Rotten City Cultural District is a place where art is produced, displayed, and the creative economy is celebrated.

Just as food is celebrated when served farm to table, the City long known as the Rottenest City west of Mississippi, proves with its Cultural District, a once rotten city can create fertile ground for creative endeavors. As murals explode across the District since the Sea Wall Festival hosted by Pangea Seed Foundation in September 2023, the proliferation of murals that include reference to the public art found in Emeryville has only begun to reveal the hidden treasures of the District.

- Procure and complete design of signage, banners, or mural(s) to brand the District



INTERPRETIVE SIGNAGE ALONG THE GREENWAY

A series of ten historic interpretive signs are planned along the southern portion of the Emeryville Greenway between Sherwin and Stanford Avenues, next to the railroad. The conditions of approval for "The Emery" project (formerly known as "Sherwin Williams") require the applicant to install six signs, and four more will be installed to the north in Horton Landing Park and on the new bicycle-pedestrian bridge over the railroad. Most of these signs will be strategically located where the viewer will be looking towards the former location of the historical feature that is described on the sign. The subject matter for these signs has been developed by City staff. Here is a summary, from south to north:



1. Welcome to the Emeryville Greenway. This sign will tell the story of the transformation of the former Southern Pacific Interurban Electric Railway (IER) commuter rail line into a pedestrian and bicycle path through the city, connecting with Oakland to the south and Berkeley and Albany to the north.




factory that existed on the site of The Emery project for 85 years, from 1920 to 2005, until it was moved to Reno, Nevada. The factory sported an animated neon sign that was 75 feet tall by 320 feet wide, and could easily be seen from Treasure Island and the Bay Bridge.






3. Judson Manufacturing. The third sign will describe the oldest and largest industrial facility in Emeryville, founded by Egbert Judson in 1882, which was replaced by IKEA 115 years later in 1997. Wallace Christie, Emeryville's first Mayor, who held office for 40 years, was Judson's Assistant Manager, and a "pre-meet" for the first meeting of the Emeryville City Council took place in his office at the Judson plant.

4. Two Emeryville Pioneers. In 1859, Edward Wiard acquired 115 acres on which he developed a horse racing track and an amusement park. The same year, Joseph Emery acquired 185 acres to the south and laid out the Park Avenue District. This sign will describe the

that is now Emeryville was once part of a vast Spanish land grant called Rancho San Antonio, which was given to Luís María Peralta in 1820 for his service to the crown. This sign will describe the history of the rancho.






6. Temescal Creek. For millennia, since long before human habitation of the area, Temescal Creek drained an area of about seven square miles of what is now North Oakland and Emeryville. The indigenous people settled around the willow thicket at its mouth, and Vicente Peralta built his hacienda near the creek. This sign will be located just south of the Greenway bridge over the creek.

7. Welcome to Huchiun. This "land acknowledgment" will pay tribute to the indigenous people of the area and will emphasize the great importance of the land between Oakland and Richmond, known as Huchiun, to the Ohlone people, who have lived here for millennia.



8. Shell Mound Park. This sian



9. Northern Railway. Mounted on the railing at the east end of the new pedestrian-bicycle bridge, with a panoramic view of the rail line below, this sign will tell the story of the Northern Railway, completed in 1879, which provided a direct route from Sacramento to the Bay, via the world's largest railroad ferry across the Carquinez Strait.

10. Emeryville's Horse Racing Track. The tenth sign will be mounted on the railing at the west end of the new pedestrian-bicycle bridge, and will feature a photograph taken from almost the same vantage point over 100 years ago showing Oakland Trotting Park, the large horse racing track that once stood where the BioMed Realty and Grifols research and development campuses are

ANNUAL PAVING PROJECT



The 2022 annual paving project was completed in Winter 2022 with reconfigurations of streets in compliance with Emeryville's Complete Street Policy

to improve safety for pedestrians and bicycles. New and improved facilities were installed on 47th Street, Steve Dain Drive, Doyle Street, 41st Street, and various intersections along Adeline Street. Updated details on the 2022 project and future paving projects can be found here.

QUIET ZONE

The Quiet Zone project kicked off in June 2022 and construction is expected to last 12-18 months with the establishment of a quiet zone in early 2024. The crossing at 65th and 67th Streets will be receiving



engineering improvements and the crossing at 66th will be permanently closed. Find more project details here.

HORTON & 53RD STREET CYCLETRACKS AND TRAFFIC CALMING

As a part of the new BioMed Realty "Emery Yards" development project, Horton Street from 45th to 53rd and 53rd Street from Hollis to Horton work will be underway for construction of traffic calming, new streetlighting, and cycletracks. Anticipated opening of these improvements is Spring 2024.

GREENWAY

Take a st(roll) over to 66th & the Greenway to check out the new bicycle and pedestrian counter. This counter will allow the city to track usage over time and support applications for future bicycle and pedestrian projects.

In partnership with CalTrans, the City will be installing a large hydrodynamic separator to capture trash from the storm drain on West MacArthur near Emery Street. Work is anticipated to be complete by the end of

MARINA PARK AND POWELL STREET LIGHTING **IMPROVEMENTS**

New lighting upgrades are coming to the parking lots and trails in the Emeryville Marina Park in 2023. Lighting and pole



upgrades will also be installed along Powell Street west of I-80.

STREETLIGHT PAINTING

Keep your eyes out, throughout 2023 all 439 of the decorative streetlight poles in Emeryville will be getting a fresh coat of paint.

40TH STREET TRANSIT-ONLY LANES AND MULTIMODAL ENHANCEMENTS PROJECT

The final designs have begun for the future of 40th Street. The Project is a two-way separated Class IV bikeway on north side of street, multimodal intersection improvements, transit-only lanes, transit island with shelters, side street pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements, and various pedestrian amenities to reduce pedestrian and bike conflicts with motor vehicles. The Project is fully funded for design with regional and state funding sources and is fully funded for the construction of the Phase 1 portion of the Project. In July 2023, City Council approved adding a Phase 2 to the project extending the Project limits 0.5 miles to Christie Avenue, now extending on 40th Street from Adeline Street on the east side, through the Bay Bridge trailhead near IKEA, and then all the way north on Shellmound Street to the Bay Trail bike/ped connection at Christie Avenue. SHERWIN AVENUE PARK AND GREENWAY

As part of the Quarterra "The Emery" project at Sherwin Avenue, a southern extension of the Emeryville Greenway, public park, and community garden are under construction and slated or opening this Fall.



CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

2023-24 to 2027-28



On June 6, 2023, the City Council adopted the 2023-2028 Capital Improvement Program (CIP), is a five-year plan which helps guide Emeryville's investment in our public buildings, parks, streets, sewers, and other City facilities. GETTING AROUND IN EMERYVILLE



The Emery Go-Round is a last-mile shuttle service, provided by the Emeryville Transportation Management Association, to connect employees, residents and visitors of Emeryville from the MacArthur BART Station to various locations throughout the City. The service is fare-free and open to the public.

The service is primarily funded by property owners in the citywide Property and Business Improvement District (PBID). It is partially funded by the Alameda County Transportation Commission.




Emery Go-Round is a service of the Emeryville Transportation Management Association, a non-profit organization whose primary objective is to increase access and mobility to, from and within Emeryville while alleviating congestion through operation of the shuttle program. The organization is governed by a Board of Directors, who also serve as the official representatives of property owners for the business improvement district. The Board of Directors hold regular meetings which are open to the public. The meetings are scheduled for the third Thursday of most months and are held at 9:15 am.



THE EMERY

As part of the Sherwin Williams Redevelopment project ("The Emery") community benefits, the developer has funded a shuttle from the project site to West Oakland BART station that started operating in October 2022. This free shuttle available for everyone and is operated by the Emery Go Around.



SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

As a part of the City's Economic Development strategy to provide cost relief for targeted industries, the city offers annual rebates to small independent retail and restaurant owners for one or all of the following: Business License Tax, Fire Inspection Fee, Cabaret License Fee, and/or Sidewalk Sign Permit Fee rebates.

Eligibility: Small independent retail or restaurant owners (incl. bar, lounge, nightclubs) with 12 or fewer locations globally incl. franchisees

City of Emeryville Labor Standards

The Emeryville City Council adopted the Emeryville Minimum Ordinance (EMC 5-37) on July 2, 2015.

The Ordinance requires higher rates for minimum wage and paid sick leave for eligible employees than the State of California. It also requires that all Hospitality Service Charges are paid to the Hospitality Workers who work the events for which a service charge is collected. Each year the minimum wage rates will increase on July 1st. The minimum wage starting July 2023 will be \$18.67.

In November 2000, Alameda County voters approved Measure B, a 0.5% sales tax, to deliver essential transportation improvement and services. In November 2014 voters approved Measure BB which provided for a 30 year extension of the 0.5% sales tax and an additional 0.5% to bring it up to a 1% sales tax. In November 2010, Alameda County voters approved the Vehicle Registration Fee (VRF) Program, thereby authorizing the collection of an annual vehicle registration fee starting in May 2011. Funds raised by the VRF Program are for local transportation purposes in Alameda County.

Each year, the City of Emeryville receives approximately:

- \$500,000 in Measure BB funding to improve and maintain our local streets and roads
- \$50,000 in measure BB funding to construct and upgrade pedestrian and bicycle facilities
- \$60,000 in measure BB funding or paratransit assistance to aid in the mobility of seniors and persons with impairments
- \$45,000 in Vehicle Registration Fee funding to reduce congestion and vehicle pollution.

- Annual Street Rehabilitation and Preventive Maintenance Project
- Doyle Street Quick-Build, Phase 2
- Innovative Deployments to Enhance Arterials (IDEA) Project

- 40th Street Transit-Only Lanes and Multi-Modal Enhancements Project.




