## POLICE CHIEF

## **DEFINITION:**

Reviews, establishes or approves criteria for work of Police Department employees engaged in patrol, traffic control, investigation, identification records and communications.

## **DESCRIPTION:**

- 1) Coordinates City law enforcement activities with those of other agencies.
- 2) Assists in the development of municipal law enforcement policies.
- 3) Establishes, reviews and maintains a comprehensive community relations program.
- 4) Receives citizens' complaints and problems and directs necessary investigations and recommends or takes appropriate action to resolve problem.
- 5) Confers with citizens and City officials on wide variety of law enforcement problems.
- 6) Prepares and administers budgets and fiscal policies subject to administrative review.
- 7) Reviews staff reports and service demands, and devises or approves plans, organization, staffing assignments and procedures.
- 8) Reviews special studies and investigations.
- 9) Reviews and establishes or approves revisions of employee training and assignment.
- 10) Establishes rules and regulations and sets disciplinary actions for violations.
- 11) Hears and reviews appeals by employees concerning disciplinary actions.
- 12) Attends civil functions and promotes police public relations.
- 13) Attends conferences and keeps abreast of modern law enforcement practices.
