Did you know when you **recycle right** and avoid **overfilling your containers**, you are helping Emeryville stay clean and green while also creating a sustainable future for the next generation?



SURCHARGES BEGIN JANUARY 1, 2021

Our goal is prevention. However, on January 1, 2021 surcharges will be implemented when contamination and overfilled carts are found. These surcharges help offset costs associated with processing contaminated recyclables and disposing of contaminated and excess materials.

Contamination	1-2 Incidents	3rd Incident	4th and > Incidents
Recycling & Organics Cart	Warning	\$25	\$50
Recycling & Organics Bin	Warning	\$75	\$100

Overage	Per Incident
Recycling/Organics/Trash Cart	Minimum \$8.71*
Recycling/Organics/Trash Bin	\$65.75

^{*}Lids should be flat. Charges are based on a typical 13 gallon trash bag (\$.67 per gallon).



WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

WM will use WM Smart TruckSM technology to photograph overfilled carts and contaminants in recycling and organics containers and will send a letter with a photograph explaining what we found along with tips to avoid overage or contamination in the future.

You will be assessed a contamination surcharge after two warnings, and an overage surcharge after each incident. Our goal is to increase diversion and decrease litter. Now is your chance to make sure you have the correct service level and are recycling right. Place only food scraps, food soiled paper, and yard waste into your organics cart.
