6. Information Items

6.1 Rental Preservation Rehab Program Outline

Staff provided an outline on the Rental Preservation Rehab Program. Program will provide low interest loans for multi-unit rental housing developments to support renovation work. Program requirements, eligible activities, loan terms, and affordability requirements were discussed.

Member Comments/Questions included:

- Adding a tenant survey or identification of tenant concerns to be included in the application process
- Removing new affordable unit requirement and making the product just be a loan.
- Concern over if existing properties will access the funds through this program
- Why do existing properties need funding to address repairs, instead of utilizing rental revenue?

- Will there be a requirement for a Labor Agreement?
- Can funding go to tenants to address repairs in their units?

6.2 Multifamily Essential Rehab Program Outline

Staff provided an outline on the Multifamily Essential Rehab Program. Program will provide grant funds to address deferred maintenance and repairs on affordable housing projects. Program requirements, eligible uses, financing terms and proposed timeline.

Staff provided an overview of the proposed marketing efforts for the tenant protection survey which will be used to collect feedback from renters, rental owners and property managers in Emeryville about their experiences with eviction and existing tenant protection ordinances.
